

V-V complexes in Old Japanese

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In this talk I will present and discuss the main features of V-V complexes in Old Japanese, which is the earliest attested stage of the Japanese language, dating mainly from the 8th century AD, building on earlier work as presented the references listed below and using the material contained in the *Oxford Corpus of Old Japanese* (see <http://vsarpj.orinst.ox.ac.uk/corpus/>).

V-V complexes in Old Japanese seem to display differences from Modern Japanese both with regard to types of morpho(phono)logical formation and in the syntax of the resulting complexes.
